

Garden #5 - Please return to entry table

This former beef farm was purchased in 2008, and over the last 9 years the owners have worked to keep the balance between gardens and nature by allowing the perimeters to remain in their natural state to accommodate the abundance of wildlife. The meadow, small stream, pond, and nut trees offer shelter and food for countless birds. Over time, shrubs, annuals, vegetable beds, and the perennial gardens punctuated with architectural highlights were added. Of particular interest is a 'dyers garden' that features plants used to dye the wool from the animals including sheep, angora goat, angora rabbits and an alpaca.
